This hospital is the largest health care facility in Africa, and the only public hospital in Soweto, serving about 3.5 million people. Our visit begins with a lunch briefing on the



impact of HIV/AIDS on women and children in South Africa, by Dr. James McIntyre, Director of the Perinatal HIV Research Unit and Mary Crewe, Director of the Centre for the Study of AIDS, University of Pretoria.

Initiated in 1991, the Unit collaborates with UNAIDS, The Institute for Child Health in London, the European Collaborative Study of Children Born to HIV Positive Mothers and other international and South African AIDS researchers. It is one of five centres in Africa working on a major UNAIDS research project on vertical transmission of HIV.

This project aims to transform a nature reserve in the center of one of the poorest and most densely populated areas of the Western Cape, into a treasured community resource. Driftsands is a largely impoverished area located a few kilometers outside Cape Town. Informal shack settlements and low cost housing surround the reserve. It is

estimated that some 550,000 people are housed within a 5 km radius and that 65% of the residents of this area are unemployed. The Botanical Society of South Africa has identified Driftsands as one of the 37 core conservation areas of the Cape metropolitan area because of its pockets of rare and endangered vegetation.
